## Britain before the Romans Manicum Key People

- The Celts lived in Britain from roughly 600BC to 43AD.
- They lived during the Iron Age, which is when people discovered and used iron in their daily lives to make tools and decorations.
- The Romans referred to the Celts as Britons.

Julius Caesar- Roman Emperor who tried to invade Britain in 55BC.

Claudius- Roman Emperor who successfully invaded Britain in 43AD.

Romans in Britain

Julius Caesar first invaded Britain in 55 BC. There were Sicilia several battles between the Roman army and the Celtic tribes who lived in Britain at the time, but the Romans Mare didn't have a large enough army and they retreated.

- Battles continued for several years afterwards The Romans gained control and Britain became part of the Roman Empire.

The following year, Julius Caesar attacked Britain again with a larger army. They still didn't defeat the Celts but the Romans promised to leave Britain if the Celts paid tribute to Rome
